

Thangka lining with silk crepeline procedure

- 1) Stretch silk crepeline onto stretcher slightly bigger than original painting.
- 2) Place stretched crepeline face down onto a sheet of Mylar.
- 3) Coat stretched crepeline with two layers of adhesive with a brush. Allow to dry.
- 4) Place thangka face down on new, clean piece of Mylar. Secure in corners with masking tape.
- 5) Place coated crepeline screen onto thangka. Check to make sure that weave lines on crepeline match weave lines on the thangka. Mark correct placement with masking tape on the Mylar.
- 6) Remove crepeline screen.
- 7) Reactivate adhesive on crepeline screen with ethyl acetate with a wide brush.
- 8) Immediately place crepeline screen face down onto thangka in the previously marked position.
- 9) Exert pressure on the reverse with a flat hand through another Mylar sheet, chasing air bubbles to the outside.
- 10) After complete drying, cut the crepeline from the screen.
- 11) Remove the masking tape securing the corners of the thangka and adhere these spots using the same process.

Recipe for adhesive:

- ➤ 1/3 volume of ethyl acetate/methylcellulose (50/50) thickener and lowers adhesive power
- ➤ 2/3 volume of Plextol B500 (75% solution in water) adhesive
